

# SA's top 100 vehicle sales: August

Johannesburg - South Africa's vehicle sales took another knock in August as the weak economy weighed down the local market while exports continued to surge.

A total of 55 055 vehicles were sold last month, down 8.2 percent on August 2014, with the passenger car and LCV sectors both losing 7.8 percent while medium and heavy commercial vehicles dropped a more worrying 11.2 and 17.9 percent respectively.

Naamsa predicts that the downward sales trend will continue over the medium term as declining business confidence and consumer sentiment take their toll, and this in spite of attractive incentive packages being offered by most carmakers due to the difficult trading conditions.

The only real positive news is export sales which, at 28 069 units, represented a 12.3 percent year-on-year growth, helping the manufacturers to withstand the blow of falling local sales and a weakening rand.

On that note, Nicholas Nkosi of Standard Bank noted: "Whilst still early to understand the full impact of the depreciation of the rand against major currencies, this will add continued pressure on new passenger vehicles and we anticipate that the current year on year declines will continue for the remainder of 2015."

#### **CHART TOPPERS**

Volkswagen's Polo Vivo rose to the top of the sales charts in August as the bakkie battle took a back seat, with both the Toyota Hilux and Ford Ranger having dropped well below their peaks of over 3000 unit sales in earlier months of the year. Nonetheless, it was a close battle, with the Ranger narrowly ousting the Hilux (2472 to 2449) as both near the end of their model cycles. Ford is expected to launch its **upgraded Ranger** late in the year, with Toyota's **all-new Hilux** set to follow early in 2016.

Further down the rankings, the Ford Ecosport and repositioned Fiesta have both gained in popularity in recent times and held steady last month with sales of 1027 and 1230 units respectively.
